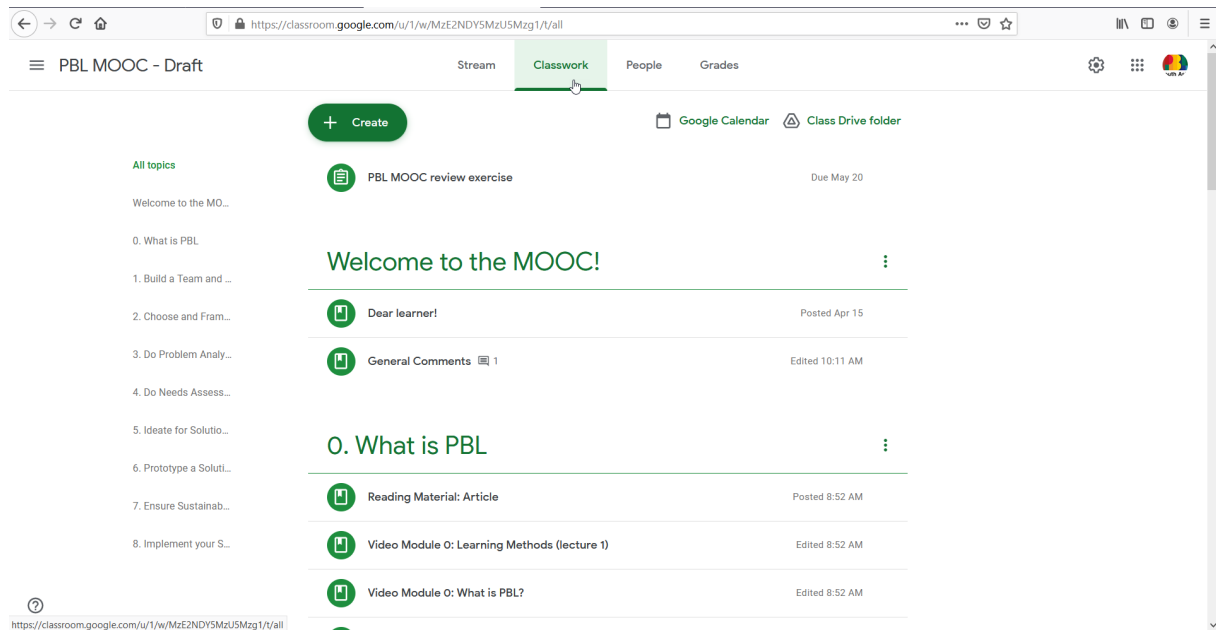


Dear all,
